FUNDING OPTIONS FOR YOU ACTION TRACKCHAIR

Insurance/Medicare:

Will Insurance or Medicare pay for an Action Trackchair?

We have had some success with this depending on the state you reside in and your particular provider. The individuals that have had part or all of the Action Trackchair covered by insurance have had private insurance. The insurance companies have required a Doctor or Therapist write a recommendation letter or Rx, deeming the Action Trackchair a "Quality of Life Enhancement". The Action Trackchair was granted a Healthcare Common Procedure Coding System in 2015 allowing medical professionals the ability to write a prescription (Rx).

Department of Vocational Rehabilitation:

Agricultural Resources:

Individuals looking for help with funding an Action Trackchair for Agricultural use.

AgrAbility: There are over 20 programs throughout the US operated through the state's collegiate system. For example, the AgrAbility of Wisconsin program is a partnership between UW-Madison, UW-Extension and Easter Seals. Each AgrAbility program assists agriculture workers with disabilities and limitations to continue their occupation by recommending assistive technology, additional strategies for chores, or possible modifications to make the workload easier. The funding for the Action Trackchair will not come directly from the AgrAbility program; however, the program can suggest other funding options, including state vocational rehabilitation programs or private and federal grant opportunities.
